2018 Awardee of the AWMA "Pollution Prevention Award"

Transit Middle School - Team 22 - "Ouerencia"

For the second year in a row this year's Pollution Prevention Award went to Transit Middle School. This year's theme for the Future City Competition was "The Age Friendly City".

This city had Multiple Renewable Energy Sources - Geothermal, Nuclear, Wind, Water and Solar.

Brackish Water was filtered during the Hydropower production using a Carbon Aerogel - a colloid with its liquid

parts emitted and replaced with carbonic gas. This altered it into a solid with a spongy texture (the lightest material on the earth.

The city had Vertical Gardens. Residential buildings were made of recycled materials.

Age Accessible Transportation included: Ultra Powered Skates, Compressed Air Cars, and a Sky Cart – a Solar Powered Pulley System.

The display was very attractive and the students were very knowledgeable.



James G. Strickland Memorial NYSDEC Summer Camp Scholarship



It is with great sadness that we report the passing of James G. Strickland on January 31, 2018. Jim was a long-time member of A&WMA-NFS and had been a Director since September 2011.

Jim grew up in Tonawanda, NY and graduated from Sweet Home High School. After receiving a BS in Engineering from SUNY @ Buffalo, Jim moved to Albany, NY to begin a career that lasted more than 34 years with New York State. His first position was with the Public Service Commission. He then moved over to the Environmental Facilities Corporation before finally settling in at the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) in Albany. Jim moved back to Buffalo in 1995 to become the Regional Hazardous Waste Engineer in the Buffalo Office of the DEC. In 2011, Jim was promoted to the position of Regional Engineer, a position he held at the time of his death. While in this position, Jim was responsible for the management of over 70 environmental professionals working in the Divisions of Air, Hazardous Waste (RCRA), Hazardous Waste Remediation, Materials Management and Water.

Jim was an avid follower of the Bills and Sabres and he enjoyed golfing, playing hockey, riding his bike and making golf clubs. He is survived by three brothers.

The A&WMA-NFS annually provides scholarships to local youths age 11 to 17 to attend a NYSDEC Summer Camp. In memory of Jim, the Board has decided to rename these scholarships the James G. Strickland Memorial NYSDEC Summer Camp Scholarship. In addition, the Buffalo Office of the NYSDEC has collected donations in Jim's memory to purchase memorial benches that will be dedicated at the Reinstein Woods Nature Preserve & Environmental Education Center located in Depew in late spring or early summer. Money has also been collected by the DEC to help fund the James G. Strickland Memorial NYSDEC Summer Camp Scholarships.
